

## Intermountain District Education Committee Report 2009

The educational institutions of the Church of the Nazarene face many challenges. In view of this we, the Committee on Education, solicit pastors and laypersons to give cooperation, support, and prayers for Northwest Nazarene University, Nazarene Theological Seminary, and Nazarene Bible College.

We recommend the following:

1. That the college-age youth of our churches be encouraged to give first preference to enroll at NNU. Prospective students are encouraged to contact Carly Peck or Jennifer Knight at 208-467-8000 or 1-877-NNU-4-YOU (transfer students are encouraged to contact Anna Lee) for admission and financial aid information.

2. That every church strive to pay its Education Budget in full and that each church on the district cooperate with the Trustees Award Program in order to make funds available for their young people to attend NNU. NNU will match as follows:

We commend all churches that are involved in the matching program and encourage them to give above the \$300 matching amount to students attending NNU.

We further recommend that local churches, with the prompting of the university, see that the awards be announced at high school graduations or award assemblies as well as in worship services.

3. That the alumni and friends of the university work with Tahmina Martelly (telephone: 801-265-3403 or email tahminam@msn.com) or Phyllis Hartley Perkins (telephone: 208-468-0579 or email phyperkins@aol.com), Alumni Representatives for the Intermountain District, and unite in the effort to promote the work of NNU by praying for the university, recruiting young people, and giving to the University Fund.

4. That our people be encouraged to invest in the work of NNU through charitable gift annuities, charitable trusts, and by placing NNU in their last wills and testaments. Donors should be encouraged to give to the General Endowment Fund or unrestricted University Fund.

5. That every church be strongly encouraged to participate in raising funds for endowed scholarships (including the Ministerial Scholarship Program) to provide greater financial support and reduce the net costs to our youth who attend NNU.

6. That Idaho residents give consideration to contributing to NNU, in view of state tax laws favoring contributions to private colleges/universities, and that tax law information be available to our churches.

7. That each local church cooperate with the university in the following ways:

- a. Assist with recruiting prospective students.
  - (1) Encourage all senior high school students to participate in and send all high school juniors and seniors to one of the Explore NNU or Friday Escape events held at various times throughout the year at NNU.
  - (2) Maintain a supply of literature about the university.
  - (3) See that the Admissions Office of the University receives the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of the local junior and senior high church youth and other potential college students.
  - (4) Publicly acknowledge in a worship service all students receiving matching awards from NNU.
- b. Remember its college students in prayer and give special attention to all missionary and international students.
- c. Promote NNU by a positive attitude, allowing university groups to hold services.
- d. Open the church schedule to the ministries of students, faculty, and staff to be a resource for needs of local churches.
- e. Enter into partnership with the university by encouraging Work & Witness type teams from the local church to assist the university in special projects.
- f. Encourage support of the NNU Volunteer Association whose members give staff support to various needs of the university.
- g. Observe Nazarene University Day, which is scheduled for April 18, 2010.
- h. Cooperate with, support, and pray for the Ministerial Scholarship program and participating students.

8. That all new pastors and associates who have never visited the campus of NNU be encouraged to do so as soon as possible. The University will provide lodging and meals for new pastors who are visiting NNU. For more information, contact Rev. Fred Fullerton, Vice President of Spiritual and Leadership Development, at (208) 467-8949.

9. That each local congregation consider providing a budget line item for pastoral continuing education.

10. That the Intermountain District churches continue to pray for and participate in the annual offerings for Nazarene Theological Seminary and Nazarene Bible College.

11. That pastors and parents of Nazarene young people attending other colleges notify pastors in the college community so that they may give spiritual support to these young people.

12. That, as NNU desires to promote itself on the local church level, each church provide promotional time and space to the university and its representatives in services and in common meeting areas of the church.

13. That each local congregation appoint an NNU Church Representative who will:

- a. Accept responsibility for receiving and distributing communications from the university.

b. Work in conjunction with the pastor/pastoral staff to see that this information gets to the various departments of the church.

14. That, in addition to College Day, each local church body should coordinate and facilitate with NNU an “NNU Church Invasion Day” Sunday morning program.
